Woodley town centre public toilet gets go ahead

The council will be proceeding with the installation of a public toilet in the town centre, having received the summary report of the Residents' Survey. The survey results showed support from 62.9% of those responding for the provision of a standalone, accessible public toilet being provided in Woodley. Council Leader, Councillor Keith Baker, said the Council had agreed to seek people's views through the doorstep and online surveys carried out by independent company HMR, and that the project would now proceed following the clear majority in favour of a new toilet. The Council is continuing discussions with Wokingham Borough Council on the preferred site for the toilet (in Crockhamwell Road car park) and will apply for planning permission once the site is confirmed.

The single standalone, semi-automatic and accessible toilet will be supplied by Danfo, who were selected following a tendering process. It is not possible at this point to be definite about the installation date because of the permissions to be agreed before work can start. A copy of the Residents' Survey Summary report can be downloaded from the Town Council's website.

Whether you are looking for space to hold a business meeting or for training, a hall for a community group activity or just want to meet with friends over a coffee – the Oakwood Centre has it all.

3rd Generation all weather pitch project

The Council has now had the final sign off from planners at Wokingham Borough Council for the planning conditions that needed to be met before construction could begin on the all weather pitch. Works are scheduled to start on 7 March. This project also includes the refurbishment of one tennis/netball court, additional parking on part of the former hard surface area and the remodelling and resurfacing of the access road and the main car park area. Once works start there may be some disruption to parking and access to Woodford Park Leisure Centre, especially when the resurfacing takes place. We will try to keep our customers up to date on the resurfacing arrangements by notices and on our website.

Woodley Town Centre – north end project

The joint project led by Wokingham Borough Council, in partnership with Woodley Town Council and Woodley Town Centre Management Initiative, to refurbish the north end of the town centre (the Headley Road end) is now at the initial design stage. The main works will be the removal of the pagoda and the installation of a new shelter, which will be set further back towards Headley Road to open the space up, and the addition of new seating and lighting in this space as well as new play activities for children. When detailed drawings are available, these will be displayed at the Oakwood Centre, on the Town Council's website and via the WBC Facebook page so the public can submit their comments.

Woodley 10K road race

After a year's absence, the popular Woodley 10km road race returns on Sunday 8 May and is now organized by Barnes Fitness. The slightly changed course is still fast and flat and is certified by RunBritain as exactly 10 kilometres. The chip-timed race is open to runners aged 16 and over and starts from Woodford Park at 9.30am. Entry fees are £15 for UK Athletics-affiliated runners and £17 for non-affiliated.

There are prizes courtesy of Mizuno for the first three men and women across the line as well as for age group winners. Woodley United FC will be distributing drinks to runners and handing out medals and goody bags at the end of the run. Barnes Fitness will be supporting Woodley Town Council Mayor's charity DrugFAM, with £1 from every entry going to help the charity in its work supporting families dealing with drug addiction.

Precept and Budget information 2016/17

This is my third year as Leader of the Council of this exceptional Town and it has been a great privilege working on behalf of you, the residents. Recognising the continuing financially constrained times for residents, one of our priorities has been to try and reduce the Town Council tax they pay. As a retired person I know firsthand about the impact that low interest rates have on pensioners' savings. My children, now grown up with children of their own, tell me all about the difficulty of coping with minimal or no pay rises year on year.

With these points in mind we tried very hard to achieve a reduction as we still believe the Town Council Tax is too high. Unfortunately a number of financial "uncertainties" like automatic enrolment in pensions and increased

National Insurance have hit us this year. Therefore it was not possible to reduce the council tax but we are going to freeze it to the same level as last year. We fully intend to resume the downward pressure in 2017/18.

At the same time as making these savings we have started the work on our ambitious plans to regenerate the North End of the Town Centre together with the new 3G Football Pitch. Future projects for later this year focus on Woodford Park covering both the leisure centre and the park itself.

Last May, following the Town Council elections, a large number of councillors are no longer on the Council, either due to retirement or not being re-elected. I would like to thank all of them for their supreme efforts over the previous

years, some going back many years. Their contribution to making Woodley such a wonderful place is fully recognised.

At this point I would like to publicly thank all the staff, both full and part time, for all their hard work during the year. In particular their supreme efforts in coping with the financial unknowns whilst maintaining services that you value.

Finally may I thank you, the residents, for the continuing support you give the Town Council through your participation in everything we do. We will never forget that this is your money that the Council is spending so it is important that we know how you feel about this and would welcome any feedback you might have.
